1. Beth Bennett reported that the 2011 Course Review was almost complete (see attachment); only two courses remain from the 2011 review cycle.
 - a. **GES 225 SB *Impacts Major Engineering Accomplishments*** – has been recommended for approval by the subcommittee and has been opened for voting.
 - b. **SW 200 HI *History of Social Welfare in the United States*** –has a mixed review from the subcommittee and requires some discussion before being opened for voting.
 - i. George McClure, chair of the subcommittee, explained that two of the three committee members recommended against approval for the course on two grounds:
 1. Criterion #7 for HI courses -- *This course presents the most extensive overview of the major course content available to students at The University of Alabama. No course shall carry the HI designation if its content is available in another course with greater breadth.*
 2. Instructor of the course is not an historian.
 - ii. Kathy Bolland reported that the course is not intended to replace the need for students to take HI courses, such as Western or American Civilization, nor was it a course in Social Work, per se, but that it met the other criteria.
 - iii. CCOC members were encouraged to review the course syllabus, the course review by the subcommittee, and the criteria for HI courses before voting to approve or not SW 200.
2. Beth opened discussion from the members on this year's review cycle.
 - a. Marsha Adams reported that the feature of the review program, which indicated voting on a course had been completed, was not working this year – keeping track of where one was in the review process became more difficult. Beth said she would check with Jason Phillips to see if that feature could be restored for next year.
 - b. David Cordes raised the issue from the CCOC November meeting about different levels of accountability for different core designations and the possibility of adopting minimal standards for all; Beth said that modification of our template guidelines should wait until the 5-year cycle had been completed.

- c. David Cordes also reported that there had been a problem for his students enrolled in the University Scholars Program getting W designation credit for split level W courses taken at the 500 level; Mary Ellen Hanna and Brenda Hunter said that there had been work done on the University Scholars Program and they thought such issues had been resolved.
 - d. The question was raised – how many negative, “or disapprove,” votes should constitute grounds for not recommending approval?
 - i. Some members thought courses should have approval on all criteria.
 - ii. Beth said that in terms of the W course reviews, the subcommittee had been more lenient because writing is widely interpreted across campus.
 - 1. This year, we gave department chairs the opportunity to provide more information about writing assignments, with an upload button for materials beyond the syllabus, but few took advantage of the option.
 - 2. The suggestion had been made that the CCOC provide exact instructions on what words should appear on the syllabus.
 - 3. Committee members seemed to agree that the problem was not contractual words on the syllabus but rather the explanation of how writing was being evaluated by the instructor in the overall framework of the course.
 - e. Beth said that the CCOC review process is designed to check to see if courses are in compliance with the institutional guidelines for core curriculum designations.
 - i. The CCOC has not been given the authority to assess the quality of instruction in core courses nor does it function as an enforcement body – we designed the review program to give the department or program head the responsibility for maintaining compliance in between reviews.
 - ii. We are already seeing that a few courses we approved in the first two years of this review cycle are not being held to the necessary criteria.
 - iii. One committee member reported that his College dean was claiming that the 35 enrollment cap for W courses was going to be ignored and asked if the CCOC had the authority to challenge that.
 - iv. Beth stated that the CCOC was advisory to the Office of Academic Affairs and the Provost.
3. Beth introduced Bob Smallwood to the committee and explained that, due to recent SACS changes pertaining to General Education, we are being asking to consider assessment measures for the Core Curriculum prior to the end of our 5-year review cycle.
- a. Bob emphasized that he appreciated the work being done by the CCOC and that he wanted to report generally on some possible assessment approaches we could consider here at UA, with the idea that some pilot strategies might be initiated for 2012-13.
 - b. He described two general approaches being used elsewhere.
 - i. Using commercially prepared standardized instruments, e.g. at the “rising junior” level.

- ii. Developing core competencies associated with undergraduate programs and departments with the help of WEAVE.
 - c. Members asked questions about determining baselines for learning outcomes and how proficiencies might be demonstrated, to which Bob responded that SACS has softened its wording on some of these issues, giving more flexibility.
 - d. David Cordes asked that since SACS requires the assessment of general education and the state of Alabama has defined the boundaries for general education, could we limit our assessment to the parts of the UA Core Curriculum that are included in the state's general education program?
 - i. Bob responded that UA made that argument in 2004, and SACS accepted it; it could be a strategy we use.
 - ii. Beth said that approach would remove W courses, as well as C courses and FL courses, from the general education assessment planning.
 - e. Beth asked to form an *ad hoc* planning subcommittee to work this next month with Bob Smallwood to develop recommendations regarding assessment measures.
 - i. The following members volunteered: Ryan Earley, David Cordes, Liza Wilson, and ZJ Wu.
 - ii. The rest of the CCOC members were asked, based on the CCOC reviews to date, to consider what common learning outcomes could be assigned for HU, SB, HI, FA, L, FC, MA, and N courses.
 - iii. The goal is for committee members to have some recommendations to make at the next CCOC meeting.
4. Members were reminded to finish voting on the two remaining courses under review. Meeting adjourned at approximately 12:50.
